Celeste Oliva is an award-winning actor of the stage and screen. Along with her lead in <u>Confidential Informant</u>, her upcoming roles include Marie on Hulu's hit series <u>Paradise</u> and Camille Russo in the Amazon series <u>56 Days</u>. She's also garnered roles in the films <u>American Fiction</u>, <u>I Care A Lot</u>, <u>Exorcist Believer</u>, Eva Viktor's <u>Sorry</u>, <u>Baby</u> and <u>Salem's Lot</u>. She's played recurring characters in HBO's <u>We Own This City</u> and CBS's <u>Bull</u>, and has guest starred in <u>Grey's Anatomy</u>, <u>NCIS Hawaii</u>, <u>Blue Bloods</u>, <u>The Blacklist</u>, <u>FBI: Most Wanted</u>, and many others.

On stage, The Boston Globe called her a "tour de force" for her "riveting solo performance" in George Brant's <u>Grounded</u>. More recently, she received an Elliott Norton Award for her role in <u>Tiny Beautiful Things</u>. She's appeared both in regional productions and off-Broadway, including roles in <u>Between Riverside and Crazy</u>, <u>Arcadia and Ch'inglish</u>, for which she received a Best of Boston award. Celeste is also a book narrator and voice actor. She's repped by The Lisa Lax Agency and managed by Entertainment Lab. Follow her on Instagram: @actingcelested.

Courtney St. Gelais (they/she) is a theatre practitioner, teaching artist, director, and film actor. Much of their professional work has been inspired by the works of Shakespeare. This influence is seen most recently in their professional directorial debut with the award-winning world premiere of Jillian Blevin's queer historical dramedy, Romeo and Her Sister, which was produced and staged at the New Hampshire Theatre Project. The production earned awards for outstanding direction of a professional play and outstanding lead and supporting actors. As a film actor, in addition to her lead role in Confidential Informant, she's appeared in the short films, **Smack-Man Resurrected**, **Avery**, and <u>Spin</u>. Spin has won multiple awards at the Rome International Film Awards and the Sweden Film Awards, and was also accepted into the Festival De Cannes short film market in 2022.

Courtney also teaches artists of all age groups, inside and outside the classroom, and holds a BFA in Acting from Salem State University. They currently reside in Manchester, New Hampshire with their husband, Tyler, and their two corgis, Eevee and Seiko.





I'm a writer & director. I write plays, film and TV scripts. I've written and directed two short films, <u>Better Angels</u> and <u>Confidential Informant</u>, which is a proof of concept for the feature film to come. I've also directed a short play of mine, <u>Fiasco</u>, off-off Broadway in New York City. My play <u>Confidential Informant</u>, upon which the film is based, was produced in Cambridge, Massachusetts at The Foundry by TC2 Theatre Company. It was performed to sold-out crowds and received standing ovations.

When I joined the TC2 Theatre Company's PlayLab, at the very first session, as I sat there listening to my fellow playwrights make their introductions, a clear thought came to mind: "If I'm going to be a part of this lab, I have to be as honest as I can be in my writing." What I wrote next was the first draft of <u>Confidential Informant.</u> It's an authentic, honest story about the different ways addiction can invade people's lives. The story's based on my many years of experience as a prosecutor and criminal defense attorney. It's both fictional and completely true. And a story I had to tell. Additional trivia: I've hitchhiked across the USA, was a laborer, a brick and stone mason, taught English in Japan, and drove a semi truck (very briefly). I was also a roadie for a Boston band, a drummer in a Boston band. And I once yelled at Johnny Rotten to get the f*ck out of my way. Mr. Rotten did so with a smile. Instagram: @charlielyonswrites



The only bio James Sullivan needs is this: I couldn't have done it without him. I asked him how he wanted to be credited for this film, and he said as director of photography. Which he was. So that's how he's credited. However, he was also the 1st Assistant Director. He kept me on schedule, managed the shoot, and got me everything I needed to complete the film. All while beautifully capturing the images and performances we needed. On a micro-budget.

He -- and the crew he put together -- was amazing. On two of the coldest nights in December, in Boston, no problem was insurmountable. They all moved in sync, methodically, with purpose, and with a clear love for the craft of filmmaking -- from minute one to hour twelve. Outstanding.
